HELP BUILD THE NEW WAVEFRONT CENTRE AND HOME FOR CHHA-BC

Later this year CHHA-BC will move its office to the new Wavefront Centre for Communication Accessibility on Quebec Street at 4th Avenue in Vancouver. The Wavefront Centre is the new headquarters of the Western Institute for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing of B.C., and is the provincial hub for services to people with hearing loss across B.C. by providing employment and personal counselling, audiology services, and consulting services on hearing loss issues.

WIDHH is fund-raising to finance this new building. There are two features to this fund-raising campaign. One feature is that, based on the total sum pledged by an individual or group, there is an opportunity to have a plaque in the name of the donor on the donor wall, or on a specific room or item in the building. The second feature is that a donor has the option to schedule donation payments in installments, over a span of up to five years, thus enhancing the financial feasibility of a contribution.

It is likely that many of our CHHA-BC members would not be in a position to make a large enough donation to qualify for a donor naming opportunity. However, if CHHA-BC members wished to do so, we could donate as a group to qualify for a donor plaque naming CHHA-BC.

Examples of how this could work financially:

75 members @ \$334.00 each = \$25,000 (payable over 3 years, with annual payment of \$112.00/ year) could result in a room named for CHHA-BC.

Or if we have 75 members @ \$134.00 each = \$10,000 (payable over 3 years, with annual payment of \$42) we could have a plaque on the donor wall, or, as a special offer, a donor plaque on the CHHA-BC office.

Or an overall donation of \$5,000 provides a naming opportunity, for example, for the Loop system in the conference room (4th floor).

In this time, I found my very first hard of hearing friends who I ended up travelling with to the conference!

Going to a hard of hearing (HOH) conference is really something you need to allow your mind, body and soul to take in. If you don't remember to breathe it can hit you like a ton of bricks because there is a lot going on. You are in the thick of networking with other hard of hearing people, learning about the latest technology, attending the workshops, and at this particular conference there was a huge focus on the newly passed Accessibility Act. In this way, the conference may be about exploring your social, technical, and political self, too. This sounds exhausting, which it is, but it is an incredible experience that I recommend, especially to any HOH young adult!

Honestly, my favorite part of the conference was the "Comedy for a Cause" show. That was my very first time experiencing an accessible comedy show and it was just so powerful exactly how accessible the show was. As a HOH person I used all the points of access - telecoil, amplification, and live captioning - that were applicable to me, which allowed me to be engaged in the entire show. JOB OPENING: OPERATIONS MANAGER

The Canadian Hard of Hearing Association, British Columbia Chapter is seeking an **Operations Manager**. CHHA BC is a not-for-profit organization focused on hearing loss self-help and advocacy, with headquarters to be based in Vancouver.

The Operations Manager will ensure that the business of the organization is carried out and will manage the running of its office. The following will encompass duties of the Operations Manager:

- supervise office staff and volunteers
- oversee budgeting, membership process, reporting, planning and auditing
- ensure all legal and regulatory processes are followed and that documents are filed in accordance with laws and regulations
- oversee outreach, represent CHHA as directed, deliver presentations and respond to inquiries and correspondence
- prepare research briefs and policy statements in accordance with the mission and work plan of the organization
- manage projects of the organization
- provide operational assistance for the annual general meeting and board meetings

Requirements:

- Bachelor's or Graduate degree in a relevant discipline
- Minimum of five years of work experience in a related field
- Experience in management, operations, and leadership
- Ability to innovate, develop, plan and implement projects
- Demonstrated attention to detail and ability to manage multiple tasks and projects
- Understanding of general finance, fundraising, budgeting, including profit and loss, balance sheet and cash-flow management
- Outstanding oral and written communication skills and the ability to build rapport and consensus with board members, volunteers, staff, and community partners
- Proven public speaking, interpersonal and problem-solving skills
- Excellent computer hardware and software skills and use of office equipment
- Adept technical skills including use of assistive technical devices for people with hearing loss (assistive listening devices, loop systems and alerting devices)
- Understanding of hearing loss issues and non-profit organizations

Compensation: \$2,000 per month for a half-time position equivalent to a 20-hour work week
