MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Message from the President

Don't let hearing loss limit you. This is the motto for this year's World Hearing Day of March 3. It is a motto to live by so that we make our choices based on our interests and inclinations, not because of having a hearing loss.

Probably the single most important choice I made was to pursue my dream of being a newspaper reporter. I had been encouraged to pursue a career as a librarian since it was felt to require less hearing than being a reporter, but I rejected this alternative. The choice was a defining moment because I was able to develop a mindset of pursuing challenges rather than shying away from them unless that is what I wanted to do. Some challenges such as jumping out of a plane with a parachute don't appeal to me at all. And, to be honest, sometimes I bought into societal norms about what could and could not be done; I never imagined becoming a politician, but have seen and encountered many successful hard of hearing and deaf politicians.

Don't let hearing loss limit you is both a personal challenge and a societal one. It requires a society that does not presume that hearing is the sole criterion for what a person can and cannot do. In recent years, great strides have been made in raising awareness and eliminating barriers. It is still very much a work in progress.



Guess what? We DO make an impact on someone else's life – even if it's just a quick glance, a smile, or even a "thank you". I opened the door today to my mail carrier (yes, I have a regular one!) and she gave me the biggest grin I've ever seen. It's almost like she was looking forward to dropping off the next Amazon package at my house. I confess we order way too much stuff online.

Let me take you back 4 months ago. My usual mail carrier (Cam was his name) no longer came around. This time it was a woman. She rang the doorbell, and asked me to sign for a parcel. I didn't quite understand what she was asking for as she spoke quite quickly. I immediately told her that I had a hearing loss and needed her to slow down.

Guess what? That one minute interaction changed EVERYTHING. Seek first to understand, then to be understood.
